MINUTES Regular Meeting April 13, 2016

The Solano County Board of Education met in regular session on Wednesday, April 13, 2016, at the Solano County Office of Education (SCOE), 5100 Business Center Drive in Fairfield, California.

I. CALL TO ORDER IN OPEN SESSION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG

Trustee Eleese Cheek, Board Vice President, chaired the meeting in the absence of Board President Dana Dean and called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM. Trustee Peggy Cohen-Thompson led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Motion was made by Trustee Bates, seconded by Trustee Coleman, and unanimously carried by a vote of those present to approve and adopt the agenda as presented.

IV. READING OF CLOSED SESSION AGENDA ITEMS

- (a) Conference with Real Property Negotiators (Government Code section 54956.8)

Trustee Cheek stated that the Board would conference with SCOE's negotiating party, Mr. Speck, regarding the property located at 4522 Abernathy Road, Fairfield, CA. Price and terms would be discussed.

V. PUBLIC COMMENT ON CLOSED SESSION AGENDA ITEMS

There was no public comment on the Closed Session item.

VI. RECESS AND RECONVENE IN CLOSED SESSION

The Board adjourned to closed session at 6:03 PM.

VII. RECONVENE IN OPEN SESSION

- (a) Call to Order

The meeting reconvened at 6:07 PM.

(b) Report of Action Taken in Closed Session (if applicable)

Trustee Cheek reported that the Board had given staff direction on how to move forward.

Due to the Closed Session appeal hearing scheduled for 7:00 PM, and in the event that it was necessary to take a recess to hear the appeal and reconvene the regular meeting afterward, the Board rearranged the order of the remaining agenda items to hear staff presentations first. Agenda items XI. Superintendent's Report and XII. Community Comments were heard prior to item VIII. Consent Items.

XI. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

(a) Technology Update

Steve Ramos, Director of Information Services and Technology, gave a brief update about the state of technology within the SCOE organization and in our local school districts. He highlighted some of the completed and in-progress projects of the past year including K-12 high-speed network support for classroom instruction and financial software services; successful contract negotiations that will provide 10 times the internet bandwidth at a lower cost to the districts than the previous provider; the migration of SCOE's email to Office 365 cloud services, which will lower software and maintenance costs and improve spam filtering, security, and communications, especially in an emergency or power outage situation; set up a cloud domain for Google Apps in SCOE's community school that enables students and teachers to communicate and share work in real time both during school and after hours; an upgrade to SCOE's aging Wi-Fi system that will allow greater service to visitors and more access to employees; and added a layer of communication between employees and the Technology Department staff by hiring a Technology Support Technician to help with training and handle day-to-day inquiries, thus freeing other staff members to work uninterrupted on more involved issues.

Future plans will address the growing need to collaborate with each other and securely access our resources (e.g., documents, emergency plans, etc.) at any time and from anywhere by solidifying our infrastructure and expanding our capabilities with virtual servers.

In response to questions from the Board, Mr. Ramos explained that: Wi-Fi and internet access is more challenging for some school locations when the land is not owned by the district, as in the case of Mare Island in Vallejo, and there are environmental restrictions for installing the necessary fiber cables; SCOE has taken steps to increase internet security by placing student computers on a separate network and moving to a cloud-based network; and the students use Chromebooks, and the services is free to school.

When asked about the use of textbooks, Lisette Estrella-Henderson, Associate Superintendent of Student Programs and Educational Services, responded that books are purchased along with web-based materials to complement the instruction and bring the books to life through technology.

Mr. Speck thanked Mr. Ramos and his team for their outstanding efforts to help the districts and prevent equipment breakage and system shutdowns so business can continue uninterrupted.

(b) Quarterly Report on *Williams* Uniform Complaints

As part of the *Williams* Uniform Complaint Procedures, school districts and SCOE are each required to report quarterly summary data regarding the nature and resolution of all complaints. Mrs. Estrella-Henderson reported that no complaints were filed during the period of January–March 2016 for the following three SCOE programs: Juvenile Court and Community School (JCCS), Division of Unaccompanied Children Services (DUCS), and Juvenile Detention Facility (JDF). (c) Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) Update

Mrs. Estrella-Henderson provided an update and a handout about SCOE's LCAP progress to date. We are nearing the end of the process, the stakeholder meetings have been completed, and data analysis indicates that SCOE remains on target toward its identified focus areas. There have been no significant

changes to the LCAP since last month's report, and an initial full draft will be presented to the Board for review in May.

(d) State and Federal Legislative Update

Mr. Speck gave an update on recent state and federal legislative activity including Senate Bill (SB) 1120 authored by Senator Lois Wolk (3rd District) and sponsored by SCOE that, if passed, would enable SCOE to renew its lease of the Irene Larsen Center in Vacaville for 50 years in order to construct and modernize facilities at the site; Assembly Bill (AB) 2306 authored by Assemblymember Jim Frazier (District 11) that would allow students in juvenile court schools, such as our Juvenile Detention Facility (JDF), to receive their high school diplomas from their district of residence (or SCOE) if they met the State Standards rather than any additional coursework required by the district's governing board; and AB 2336 would increase the number of days, from 20 to 40, that a special education substitute teacher could sub for any one teacher during a school year.

SCOE is presently analyzing the impact of Governor Brown's law increasing the minimum wage, there are still concerns about the amount of districts' required reserves, and a focus on the benefits of preschool remains. We will be watching to see what the Governor's May Budget Revisions reveal.

(e) Temporary Certificates

Temporary certificates for credential applicants approved by the County Superintendent were noted. (Attachment H)

(f) Meetings/Special Dates

Updated copies of the April and May Activity Calendars were distributed, and Mr. Speck reviewed upcoming meetings, events, and office closures noting the date change for the T.C. McDaniel Family Fun Night. This is a very busy time of year, and he encouraged the Members to check their SCOE email regularly for any time or location changes, cancellations, or new invitations.

Mr. Speck highlighted some of his many recent activities including visits to 9 of the 10 elementary schools in Solano County that were nominated to be Gold Ribbon Schools. The visitation team's recommendations were forwarded to the California Department of Education (CDE), and we were notified today that all 10 (3 in Benicia, 3 in Fairfield-Suisun, 3 in Travis, and 1 in Vacaville) will receive the award. He also attended a fundraiser for The Leaven held at Driven Raceway where he raced a go-kart against Kris Corey, Superintendent of Fairfield-Suisun Unified School District) and received the Junk Driver Award for coming in second place. It was a fun event for a worthy cause.

XIII. NEW BUSINESS

(a) Revisions to Board Policy on Expulsion Appeal Hearings

Mrs. Estrella-Henderson distributed the proposed changes to Board Policy 9000.21 regarding the timeline in which expulsion appeal hearings must be scheduled. This minor change will align the Board's policy with Education Code. The Board waived a second reading of the proposed revisions.

Motion was made by Trustee Ford, seconded by Trustee Coleman, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote of those present to approve the policy revisions.

The Board took a recess at 7:00 PM to hear an expulsion appeal. The meeting reconvened at 8:16 PM.

XIV. BOARD DISCUSSION

(a) Policy Making for Education

Trustee Ford discussed and distributed information about science and engineering indicators; science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) education; and genome and biological sciences facilities at the University of California (UC) campus in Davis and the University of Southern California (USC).

He gave a brief history about the creation of the National Science Foundation (NSF), a government agency that supports education and research in engineering and science fields other than medical. The organization, through the National Center for Science and Engineering Statistics (NCSES), collects education data that is a good resource of nonpartisan facts on student performance, STEM education, and how the U.S. compares with other countries.

(b) Board Member Activity Reports

Board members were given an opportunity to report about their recent community and education-related activities.

Trustee Cohen-Thompson attended the California School Boards Association (CSBA) Legislative Action Day, Solano Economic Development Corp (EDC) breakfast, various meetings addressing issues that impact the Vallejo City Unified School District (VCUSD) such as the proposed concrete plant near a school and a proposed water rate increase, and went to a 7th grade Shakespeare play.

Trustee Bates attended the Academic Decathlon Bowl at Golden Hills Education Center, Women's History Month luncheon, Solano EDC breakfast, Association of California School Administrators (ACSA) administrator of the year awards, a sorority fundraising event for Oakland Children's Hospital, and visited two schools through her Rotary Club.

Trustee Ford attended a meeting of the California Collaborative for Educational Excellence (CCEE), which is making progress by identifying best practices and hiring staff to assist in the work.

Trustee Coleman attended the Solano EDC breakfast and her niece's graduation with a Masters in Psychology.

Trustee Silva attended a meeting of the California Retired Teachers Association (CaRTA) where retiring teachers were honored and scholarships awarded to students headed to college to become teachers.

Trustee Cheek attended the Solano EDC breakfast, a fundraiser in San Francisco for the National Coalition of Black Women, and distributed information about upcoming events of the Vallejo Business Alliance.

(c) Board Member Requests

In accordance with Board Policy 9250, Trustee Ford said he would like to attend the California School Boards Association (CSBA) Leadership Institute in Sacramento in July. The request will be placed on the May Board meeting agenda for action.

(1) California County Boards of Education (CCBE) 2016 Annual Conference

Motion was made by Trustee Coleman, seconded by Trustee Bates, and unanimously carried by a vote of those present to approve the attendance of Trustees Cheek, Cohen-Thompson, Dean, and Ford at the CCBE Annual Conference, September 9-11, 2016, in Monterey, California.

(2) California School Boards Association (CSBA) 2016 Annual Education Conference

Motion was made by Trustee Coleman, seconded by Trustee Ford, and unanimously carried by a vote of those present to approve the attendance of Trustees Cheek, Cohen-Thompson, Dean, and Ford at the CSBA Annual Education Conference, December 1-3, 2016, in San Francisco.

WHEREAS, our Nation's children deserve to grow up in a safe and nurturing environment free from fear, abuse, and neglect; and

WHEREAS, a nurturing home environment, safe places to play, good medical care, and strong schools are needed for all children to grow in a protected and healthy environment; and

WHEREAS, the Solano County Office of Education (SCOE) recognizes its unique role in advocating for and providing a positive environment for the growth of children and working to help families and students develop the necessary skills to lead loving, productive, and satisfying lives; and

WHEREAS, SCOE demonstrates its commitment to improving the educational outcomes of children and youth by supporting National Child Abuse Prevention Month events throughout Solano County during the month of April.


