MINUTES Regular Meeting October 14, 2015

The Solano County Board of Education met in regular session on Wednesday, October 14, 2015, at the Solano County Office of Education (SCOE), 5100 Business Center Drive in Fairfield, California.

I. CALL TO ORDER IN OPEN SESSION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG

III. APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Motion was made by Trustee Dean, seconded by Trustee Ford, and carried by a unanimous vote of those present to approve and adopt the agenda as presented with the requested revisions.

V. AGENDA ITEMS REMOVED FROM CONSENT ITEMS

Nestor Aliga, a community member of Filipino descent and a veteran, spoke briefly about Filipino American History, Larry Itliong, and veterans, and he thanked the Board for honoring these events this year as well as in past years.

- (b) Resolution No. B15-16-07 recognizing Filipino American History Month and Larry Itliong Day (Attachment A)

Motion was made by Trustee Ford, seconded by Trustee Dean, and carried by a unanimous roll call vote of those present to adopt Resolution No. B15-16-07 acknowledging October as Filipino American History Month and October 25th as Larry Itliong Day.

- (h) Resolution No. B15-16-13 commemorating Veterans Day (Attachment G)

Motion was made by Trustee Ford, seconded by Trustee Cohen-Thompson, and carried by a unanimous roll call vote of those present to adopt Resolution No. B15-16-13 honoring veterans and the observance of November 11th as Veterans Day.

VI. CORRESPONDENCE

Mr. Speck read two items of correspondence: (1) a letter from Deborah Peralez, Executive Director of Child Start, thanking him for providing a letter of support that helped the organization receive Head Start and Early Head Start grant funding; and (2) a notice from the California Schoolmasters Club announcing that the yearly event honoring Educators of the Year would not be held in 2016 but was being revamped for 2017.

VII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- (a) Quarterly Report on *Williams* Uniform Complaints

As part of the *Williams* Uniform Complaint Procedures, school districts and SCOE are each required to report quarterly summary data regarding the nature and resolution of all complaints. Lisette Estrella-Henderson, Associate Superintendent of Student Programs and Educational Services, reported that there were no complaints filed with any of the following programs during the time period of July 1 – September 30, 2015: Juvenile Court and Community School (JCCS), Division of Unaccompanied Children Services (DUCS), and Juvenile Detention Facility (JDF). - (b) Human Resources Report/Contract Proposal/Public Disclosure

Janet Harden, Associate Superintendent of Human Resources/Workforce Development/Public Information, presented the proposal for the California School Employees Association (CSEA) and SCOE for 2015-16 contract negotiations. Representatives of CSEA were unable to attend.

CSEA's current contract goes through June 30, 2016. Article 15–Benefits and Salaries is open to discussion each year. In the coming year CSEA has also chosen to address Article 9–Hours of Employment, and SCOE has selected Article 5–CSEA Rights. Tomorrow will be the group's first bargaining date, and we look forward to a successful year.

Mrs. Harden also reported on routine personnel matters saying that SCOE still has some certificated vacancies, requiring substitutes and temporary workers in some classes, but active recruitment and interviews are underway. Mr. Speck added that the entire state is in the midst of a teacher shortage with SCOE being hit particularly hard by a lack of those specializing in special education.

- (c) State and Federal Legislative Update

Mr. Speck provided a brief update on state and federal legislative activity. Among the bills recently signed by Governor Brown were: (1) Suspension of the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) for this year and the next two years (through 2017-18) and allowing students of the Class of 2006 and after to receive their diplomas if they did not pass the CAHSEE but met all of their other graduation requirements; and (2) Increased support for students in foster care.

The Governor vetoed a bill by Assemblywoman Susan Bonilla that would have required participating districts to pay for the Beginning Teacher Support and Assessment (BTSA) program.

The bill placing a cap on budget reserves was placed in the suspense file and will likely come up again next year.

(d) Temporary Certificates

Temporary certificates for credential applicants approved by the County Superintendent were noted. (Attachment K)

(e) Meetings/Special Dates

Mr. Speck reviewed upcoming meetings, events, and office closures and encouraged the Members to check their SCOE e-mail regularly for any time or location changes, cancellations, or new invitations. Updated copies of the October and November Activity Calendars were distributed. He pointed out that the Regular Board Meeting in November is being held on the third Wednesday, instead of the usual second Wednesday, due to the Veterans Day holiday.

Mr. Speck's recent activities included attending a fundraising gala for The Leaven afterschool mentoring and tutoring program as well as the annual T.C. McDaniel Center Trike-A-Thon; participating in the Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) retreat with local school district superintendents and special education directors and the California County Superintendents Educational Services Association (CCSESA) quarterly meeting where he reported on SCOE's internal Leadership Academy program; and recording a public service announcement (PSA) on KUIC Radio promoting the Solano Transportation Authority's "Walk to School Day."

Mr. Speck noted that he will not be at the Regular Board Meeting in November. Mrs. Estrella Henderson will take his place.

VIII. NEW BUSINESS

(a) Single Plan for Student Achievement

Rick Vaccaro, Director of Alternative Education, and Mrs. Estrella-Henderson presented a PowerPoint about the Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA) for the programs at the Juvenile Detention Facility (JDF), Division of Unaccompanied Children's Services (DUCS), and Golden Hills Education Center. Each Plan is a framework for categorical dollars and is aligned with state priorities as well as SCOE's Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP), Local Education Agency Plan (LEAP), Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) Accreditation, and Strategic Roadmap, all of which center on student achievement and focus our efforts in the same direction.

Mr. Vaccaro reviewed the four goals for the community school at Golden Hills, three goals for JDF, and two goals for DUCS. He explained that JDF and DUCS have fewer goals because the students at those facilities receive some services, such as transition and social-emotional support, from sources other than SCOE. All three share goals related to improving the instructional program provided to students and increasing college and career readiness services.

Motion was made by Trustee Ford, seconded by Trustee Dean, and carried by a unanimous roll call vote of those present to adopt the Single Plan for Student Achievement for the JDF program.

Motion was made by Trustee Dean, seconded by Trustee Ford, and carried by a unanimous roll call vote of those present to adopt the Single Plan for Student Achievement for the DUCS program.

Motion was made by Trustee Ford, seconded by Trustee Cohen-Thompson, and carried by a unanimous roll call vote of those present to adopt the Single Plan for Student Achievement for the Golden Hills program.

(b) Resolution – Disposition of Gomer School

In accordance with the recommendations of SCOE's Advisory Committee Report ("Report"), the Board declared the Gomer Property ("Property") as surplus pursuant per Resolution No. B12-13-04. Pursuant to the first priority contained in the Report, SCOE offered the Property for sale to "nonprofit tax-exempt community or civic organization[s] with a membership comprised predominantly of persons residing in the community in which the Property is situated" pursuant to Education Code (E.C.) section 17482. However, no such qualified entities were willing to purchase the Property; therefore, a sale pursuant to E.C. §17482 is not feasible.

Pursuant to the recommendations contained in the Report, SCOE now desires to sell the Property in AS/IS condition pursuant to California law. Prior to any sale to the general public, the Property must be offered to specified entities pursuant to E.C. §17485, et seq., E.C. §17464, and Government Code section 54222, and if no offer has been made on the Property by the entities described in said sections, SCOE desires to sell the Property in a public sale, pursuant to E.C. §17466, et seq. Proposed Resolution No. B15-16-14 authorizes SCOE to proceed with offering the Property for sale first to the statutory entities and then to the general public in accordance with applicable law. Tommy Welch, Associate Superintendent of Administrative Services and Operations, reviewed the proposed resolution including a description of the Property and a concise history on how we reached this present position and the intent to sell. Each bid will require a security of \$5,000 and a minimum starting bid of \$175,000. A two-thirds vote (five favorable votes) is required to move forward, which is more than the usual majority vote needed for most other action items.

Motion was made by Trustee Ford, seconded by Trustee Cohen-Thompson, and carried by a unanimous roll call vote of those present to approve Resolution No. B15-16-14 entitled Intent to Sell, Authorizing Offer of Solano County Office of Education (SCOE) Property for Sale to Statutory Entities, and Authorizing Public Sale of Property (Gomer School Property).

IX. COMMENTS FROM THE COMMUNITY

There were no comments from the community.

X. BOARD DISCUSSION

(a) Board Member Activity Reports

Some of the Members gave brief reports on their recent education-related activities.

Trustee Silva talked about his recent visit to eastern Europe where he visited a school in Bucharest, Romania, and noted many differences between education there and in the United States.

Trustee Dean reported on the California County Boards of Education (CCBE) conference and some of the session topics she attended including charter schools and foster care.

Trustee Cohen-Thompson also attended the CCBE conference and sessions on issues such as reducing chronic absence, homeless students, and expulsion and interdistrict appeals.

Trustee Ford's recent activities included attending the CCBE conference and today's Public Policy Institute of California (PPIC) luncheon featuring Gavin Newsom, Lieutenant Governor of California, on the subject of connections between higher education and our State's economic future. He distributed copies of: (1) an article from the summer 2015 edition of the California School Boards Association (CSBA) quarterly magazine *California Schools* about the importance of the arts to enhance education; and (2) the fall schedule of Current Progress in Biotechnology seminars on the University of California at Davis campus.

Trustee Coleman attended the annual Impact Solano event, a meet-and-greet with State Assemblymember Bill Dodd and Lieutenant Governor Gavin Newsom, and a meeting of the Solano County Board of Supervisors discussing the contract of the Service Employees International Union (SEIU) bargaining unit's contract.

(b) Board Member Requests

As follow-up to interest by some of the Board Members, Mr. Speck mentioned that Session 1 of CSBA's Masters in Governance fall workshop series is now full. This is the prerequisite for the other four sessions in the series. CSBA expects to schedule another Session 1 after the first of the year. Staff will provide the details as soon as they are announced as well as information regarding the CCBE Governance Workshop specifically for county boards of education.

Trustee Dean asked to be registered for the CSBA Sessions 1 and 2 as soon as the new dates are set regardless of when they occur. Mr. Speck said staff practice is to check Member availability prior to the registration process to avoid any nonreimbursable or out-of-pocket expenses if the Member cannot attend.

(c) Suggestions on Future Board Agenda Items

- (1) Board members may suggest future topics to be coordinated by the County Superintendent and presented by SCOE staff or external presenters.

There were no topics proposed for future meeting presentations.

- (2) The Board may identify current topics of particular interest and, by consensus, choose one of its members to lead a brief discussion at a future meeting.

There were no topics proposed for potential Member-led discussions.

XI. ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at 7:03 PM.

RESOLUTION NO. B15-16-07
FILIPINO AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH & LARRY ITLIONG DAY

WHEREAS, October 18, 1587, marks the earliest documented proof of Filipino presence in the continental United States having arrived by ship and setting foot in Morro Bay, California; and

WHEREAS, the year 1763 was the date of the first permanent settlement of Filipinos in the continental United States in St. Malo, Louisiana, which set in motion a concentration of critical economic, cultural, social, and other notable contributions by Filipino Americans who have helped develop our Nation’s history in countless ways; and

WHEREAS, in 1906, the Sekada signified the first wave of Filipino farm workers to arrive in America, some of whom settled in the Suisun Valley, sent their children to Gomer School, labored as farm workers, and were an integral part of Solano County’s agricultural economy; and

WHEREAS, Filipino Americans comprised a large sector of the workforce at Mare Island Naval Shipyard and Travis Air Force Base, contributing to the military defense, growth, and history of Solano County; furthermore, according to the U.S. Census Bureau, a five-year trend indicates that the number of Filipino Americans in our community, state, and nation continues to grow, and they remain the largest Asian American group in Solano County, second largest in California, and third largest in the Nation; and

WHEREAS, born in the Philippines on October 25, 1913, the late Larry Itliong worked on the railroads and as a migrant farmworker in California, and became a leader in one of the greatest social justice movements in America as he organized 1,500 Filipinos to strike against the grape growers of Delano, while repeatedly suffering through violence, and courageously called upon other farmworkers led by César Chávez and Dolores Huerta to join forces with the Filipinos to strike together, and the two groups combined to establish the United Farm Workers of America; and

WHEREAS, the communities of Solano County have long recognized the contributions of Filipino Americans, several of whom have dedicated many years to serving the public through military and civil service, elected offices, and political policymaking in our cities and school districts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that, in accordance with California Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 58, dated July 14, 2015, and Assembly Bill No. 7, dated June 30, 2015, the Solano County Board of Education recognizes October as Filipino American History Month and October 25 as “Larry Itliong Day” and encourages teachers, students, and all members of our community to study the chronicles, strong values, rich culture, and enduring legacy of Filipino Americans as well as the significance of the positive role they have proudly and humbly played in transforming the diverse history of our great Nation

**RESOLUTION NO. B15-16-08
NATIONAL BULLYING PREVENTION MONTH**

WHEREAS, the Solano County Office of Education (SCOE) upholds the right of students and staff to attend and work in a school environment that promotes physical and emotional safety, and in which teaching, learning, and working are not disrupted or distracted; expectations for behavior are clearly communicated; consequences for infractions are consistently and fairly applied; and drugs, bullying, intimidation, harassment, discrimination, and fear are not present, as these concerns can create barriers to concentration, learning, working, and achievement, and contribute to low self-esteem, depression, anger, and, in extreme cases, violence or suicide; and

WHEREAS, the most effective approach to creating safe school environments requires a comprehensive, coordinated effort including school-, district-, and community-wide strategies where all institutions, organizations, and individuals must accept responsibility for their crucial roles and collaborate to establish a positive environment for teaching, learning, and working; and

WHEREAS, SCOE supports local schools, districts, and communities in developing, implementing, and monitoring policies and programs to address the prevention, intervention, and elimination of bullying, harassment, and discrimination; and

WHEREAS, more than 160,000 students in the U.S. stay home from school each day because they are scared of being bullied; thus, the month of October has been declared National Bullying Prevention Month, a campaign in response to the need to raise awareness about bullying that provides schools and communities with an opportunity to educate students, parents, and others about the different forms of bullying, their role in bullying prevention, and the importance of lifting others up rather than tearing them down.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that SCOE supports the goals of National Bullying Prevention Month and will work with a broad spectrum of local community stakeholders, parents, students, teachers, and staff to develop, implement, and monitor policies and programs that foster and support a positive school climate free from harassment, bullying, discrimination, and violence; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board encourages all students, teachers, staff, and community members to value diversity; engage in respectful interactions and responsive problem solving; never tolerate cruelty; stand up for others; speak out against bullying behavior; and urge our lawmakers to invest in and promote comprehensive, coordinated, and collaborative strategies to prevent bullying, harassment, discrimination, and violence in our schools so that all students have the opportunity to attend school, engage in classroom activities, and achieve academic success.

**RESOLUTION NO. B15-16-09
SCHOOL BUS SAFETY AWARENESS MONTH**

WHEREAS, each day there are about 480,000 public school buses on our Nation’s roads transporting approximately 26 million K-12 students (53% of total students), twice a day (52 million student trips), with an additional estimated 5 million daily extracurricular activity roundtrips, and close to one million of these children are being transported to and from school and school-related activities by school buses in California; and

WHEREAS, each year school bus drivers across the U.S. log over 4.4 billion miles behind the wheel and provide over 10 billion individual pupil rides for our Nation’s children making these vehicles the largest form of public transit in the United States, yet they boast the best safety record of any other form of transportation: 172 times safer than the family automobile, 8 times safer than railroad passenger trains, 4 times safer than transit or intercity buses, and 8 times safer than scheduled airlines; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Transportation requires every school bus to have six additional safety features that are not found on any other public or private vehicle; and

WHEREAS, school buses travel every day on urban and rural roadways and are subjected to countless obstacles posing potential danger to precious passengers; and

WHEREAS, Solano County Office of Education’s transportation professionals are dedicated to protecting our students and take measures to ensure the safety of children, drivers, and others on the road including annual mandated training, adherence to strict federal drug testing policies, performing regularly scheduled inspections of all buses, and promptly reporting when maintenance is needed; and

WHEREAS, California recognizes October as School Bus Safety Awareness Month, and our Nation identifies October 19-23, 2015, as National School Bus Safety Week whose theme this year is “Be Smart – Be Seen, I wait in a safe place!” reminding students to cross the street carefully in front of the bus and out of the danger zone, and reminding motorists to be especially alert when driving around school bus zones, watch for children getting on or off the bus, and be aware of the dangers of passing a school bus when it is stopped.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Solano County Board of Education realizes the importance of school bus safety; acknowledges October as California School Bus Safety Awareness Month and October 19-23, 2015, as National School Bus Safety Week; and encourages all citizens to drive safely near school zones, avoid distractions, be mindful of school bus signals, and remind our children to use caution when waiting for or getting on and off the bus in order to avoid school bus accidents and protect the precious riders on board.

WEEK OF THE SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR

WHEREAS, research repeatedly shows that quality school leadership is essential to student success, and leadership matters for California’s public education system and the more than six million students it serves; and

WHEREAS, great schools are led by great principals, and great school districts and county offices of education are led by great superintendents, who are, in turn, supported by an extensive network of dedicated administrative professionals including assistant superintendents, assistant principals, teachers, special education and adult education leaders, curriculum and assessment experts, school business officials, classified educational leaders, and many other administrative associates, all of which fall under the broad term of “school administrator;” and

WHEREAS, many school administrators began their careers as teachers, and, in addition to their many years of beneficial experience in a classroom, they remain passionate, lifelong learners who believe in the value of public education and truly understand that providing effective and efficient leadership and quality service is paramount for improving student achievement and ensuring student success; and

WHEREAS, California once ranked first in the nation in per-pupil spending but now ranks nearly last, and public schools must often find ways to do more with less such as operating with fewer managers and supervisors than most public and private sector industries including transportation, manufacturing, food service, utilities, construction, and public administration; and

WHEREAS, school leaders depend on a network of support from school communities – fellow administrators, teachers, parents, students, businesses, community members, board trustees, colleges and universities, community and faith-based organizations, elected officials, and district and county staff and resources – to promote ongoing student achievement and school success; and

WHEREAS, school administrators were previously acknowledged in March, but the State of California, through Senate Bill 1229, recently changed Education Code 44015.1, to declare the second full week of October as the “Week of the School Administrator” in recognition that the future of California’s public education system depends upon the quality of its leadership.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Solano County Board of Education supports October 11-17, 2015, as the Week of the School Administrator and commends all school leaders for the contributions they make toward successful student achievement.

**RESOLUTION NO. B15-16-14
INTENTION TO SELL; AUTHORIZING OFFER OF
SOLANO COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION (SCOE) PROPERTY
FOR SALE TO STATUTORY ENTITIES; AND
AUTHORIZING PUBLIC SALE OF PROPERTY
(GOMER SCHOOL PROPERTY)**

WHEREAS, the Solano County Office of Education (“SCOE”) owns approximately .48 acres of certain excess real property located at 4522 Abernathy Road, Fairfield, California, known generally as the Gomer School Site, and as more particularly described in the legal description (“Property”) attached hereto as Exhibit “A”; and

WHEREAS, SCOE has previously appointed a Surplus Property Advisory Committee pursuant to Education Code section 17388, et seq., to advise the Solano County Board of Education (“Board”) in the development of SCOE-wide policies and procedures governing the use and disposition of real property which is not needed for school purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Advisory Committee has recommended in its report to the Board that the Property be declared surplus, the Board received SCOE’s Advisory Committee recommendation to declare the Property as surplus, and the Board declared the Property surplus on September 12, 2012, pursuant to Resolution No. B12-13-04; and

WHEREAS, the Property does not consist of land which is used or has been used for school playground, playing field, or other outdoor recreational purposes, nor is the Property open-space land particularly suited for recreational purposes, therefore, the Property is not subject to the requirements of Education Code sections 17485, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the recommendations in the Advisory Committee Report, SCOE first sought to sell the Property to a “nonprofit tax-exempt community or civic organization with a membership comprised predominantly of persons residing in the community in which the Property is situated” pursuant to Education Code section 17482. No such qualified entities are willing to purchase the Property; therefore, a sale pursuant to Education Code section 17482 is not feasible; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the recommendations contained in the Advisory Committee Report, SCOE now desires to sell the Property in AS IS condition pursuant to California law in order to generate the Property’s highest and best value; and

WHEREAS, prior to any sale to the public, the Property must be offered to specified entities pursuant to Education Code sections 17485, et seq., Education Code section 17464, and Government Code section 54222; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code sections 17464-17466, public notice must be given to certain entities by publication in a newspaper of general circulation; and

WHEREAS, once the appropriate time periods described in Education Code sections 17485, et seq., Education Code section 17464, and Government Code section 54222 have lapsed, and no offer has been made on the Property by the entities described in said sections, SCOE desires to sell the Property in a public sale, pursuant to Education Code section 17466, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, interested bidders for the purchase of the Property shall submit a bid proposal on a form supplied by SCOE.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Solano County Board of Education (“Board”) as follows:

1. The above recitals are true.
2. This Board does hereby announce its intention to sell the Property.
3. The Property does not consist of land which is used, or has been used, for school playground, playing field, or other outdoor recreation purposes, nor is the Property open space land particularly suited for recreation purposes; therefore, the Property is not subject to the requirements of Education Code section 17485, et seq.
4. That, while the sale of the Property is not hereby limited in any particular manner, SCOE will use its best efforts to ensure the Property is sold at its highest and best use value.
5. The Solano County Superintendent of Schools (“Superintendent”) or designee is authorized and directed to send written offers for the sale of the Property pursuant to the terms and conditions specified in Section 7.ii. of this Resolution, to the entities specified in Education Code sections 17485, et seq., Education Code section 17464, and Government Code section 54222, and written notice to SCOE’s local planning agency of the proposed disposal of the Property, pursuant to Government Code section 65402(c).
6. SCOE will not pay a real estate commission for the purchase or sale of the property, except as specifically authorized by contractual agreement with the Board.
7. In the event no entities listed in Education Code sections 17485, et seq., Education Code section 17464, or Government Code section 54222 express an interest in the Property, this Board, pursuant to Education Code section 17466, et seq., does hereby announce its intention to receive and consider proposals from the general public for the sale of the Property and authorizes SCOE to provide public notice in accordance with Education Code section 17469 at least fifteen (15) days prior to the meeting (“Public Notice”) when proposals will be received and in accordance with the following:
 - i. Each bidder shall submit with its bid proposal a certified or cashier’s check made payable to the Solano County Office of Education in the amount of FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$5,000) as bid security for entering into the purchase agreement. The deposit of the successful bidder will be retained by SCOE and applied towards the purchase of the Property, pursuant to the purchase agreement. After execution of the purchase and sale agreement by a successful bidder, or thirty (30) days, whichever comes first, all other deposits will be returned. If the successful bidder fails to execute the purchase agreement and provide all necessary documents within five (5) days of the bid opening, SCOE may retain the bid security.
 - ii. The sale of the Property shall be upon the following terms and conditions:
 - a. The minimum bid for the Property shall be ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$175,000) with the sale to be made at no less than SCOE’s appraised value or updated appraised value, or fair market value as determined by the Board, whichever is greater.
 - b. A non-refundable deposit of ten percent (10%) of the accepted purchase price shall be due immediately upon execution of the purchase agreement. Additional deposits may be required during escrow as set forth in the applicable purchase and sale agreement and/or bid documents.

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- c. Escrow shall be opened immediately and shall close no later than sixty (60) days from the date of execution of the purchase agreement, unless otherwise agreed to by SCOE in the applicable purchase agreement. The successful bidder must comply with the terms and conditions outlined in the SCOE bid documents.
 - d. The Property is sold in an “AS-IS” condition.
 - e. The purchaser shall bear all costs associated with recording fees, documentary and other transfer taxes, title insurance premiums, and other escrow costs.
 - f. The Property shall be sold on a “cash only” basis.
 - g. Any other terms that SCOE may later approve prior to the bid auction.
- iii. As of the date of the Public Notice, the Bid Documents for the purchase of the Property may be obtained from SCOE’s business office, 5100 Business Center Drive, Fairfield, CA, 94534. Although a bidder may propose changes to the purchase agreement contained in the Bid Documents, unless otherwise agreed to by SCOE, the bidder shall agree that the existing terms and conditions of the purchase agreement will be binding upon the successful bidder. Any proposed changes to the purchase agreement must be submitted with the bid proposal. Any proposed material changes to the existing terms and conditions of the purchase agreement shall render such bid a counteroffer, which counteroffer may not be accepted by SCOE should any written or oral offer be made at, or greater than, the terms and conditions set forth in the purchase agreement and the minimum terms set forth herein.
 - iv. The bid proposals shall be sealed and filed with SCOE’s business office at a specified future date and time, which date and time shall be noticed pursuant to the surplus property procedures and laws of the State of California. The Board delegates authority to the Superintendent or designee to establish the date for the submission of bid proposals and the bid auction.
 - v. At the Board meeting to be held in the SCOE Boardroom at a date and time to be determined by SCOE and included in the Bid Documents, the sealed bid proposals shall be opened, examined, and declared. The Superintendent or authorized designee shall then call for oral bids. If, upon the call for oral bidding, any responsible person’s offer to enter into said purchase agreement, upon the terms and conditions specified and for a price exceeding by at least five percent (5%) the highest written proposal for the Property, then the oral bid, which is highest for the Property, shall be finally accepted. Final acceptance shall not be made, however, until the oral bid is reduced to writing and signed by the offeror and bid security, as described herein in the form of a certified or cashier’s check payable to the Solano County Office of Education, has been submitted.
 - vi. Final acceptance of the highest bid, either written or oral, will be made at the Board meeting, wherein the bids are opened, or at any adjourned session of the same meeting held within ten (10) days. The Board may select the highest bid of any of the bids, or, if it deems such action to be for the best public interest, it may reject any and all bids. SCOE reserves the right to make non-substantive changes to the purchase agreement. The highest successful bidder shall be required to execute the purchase agreement as a requirement for final acceptance by the Board.

8. The Superintendent or designee is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of the Board's intent to sell the Property by posting executed copies of the Resolution in three (3) public places in SCOE not less than fifteen (15) days before the date of the Board meeting where bids are to be opened, and by publication of a Notice of Intent to Sell not less than once a week for three (3) consecutive weeks before the date of the meeting in a newspaper of general circulation published in the county in which SCOE or any part thereof is situated.
9. The Superintendent or designee is hereby authorized to prepare all documents, in consultation with legal counsel, deemed to be necessary to effectuate the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
