#### **VII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT**

- (a) Quarterly Report on *Williams* Uniform Complaints

## VIII. NEW BUSINESS

(a) Single Plan for Student Achievement

Gricelda Rodriguez, Program Administrator of Alternative Education, reviewed the Single Plans for Student Achievement for the programs at the Juvenile Detention Facility (JDF), Division of Unaccompanied Children's Services (DUCS), and Golden Hills Education Center. The Board approves these plans annually. This year's revisions include alignment with the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP). All three Single Plans share some goals, while others are unique to a certain program and are taken care of by another agency. (e.g., Baptist Children's and Family Services (BCFS) oversees the DUCS program, Probation oversees the JDF program, etc.)

In response to comments from the Board, Ms. Rodriguez said she will develop a graphic for future reference showing those areas for which SCOE is responsible as well as the services provided by another agency.

Motion was made by Trustee Coleman, seconded by Trustee Cohen-Thompson, and carried by a unanimous vote of those present to approve Adopt the Single Plan for Student Achievement for the JDF program.

Motion was made by Trustee Coleman, seconded by Trustee Bates, and carried by a unanimous vote of those present to approve Adopt the Single Plan for Student Achievement for the DUCS program.

Motion was made by Trustee Coleman, seconded by Trustee Cheek, and carried by a unanimous vote of those present to approve Adopt the Single Plan for Student Achievement for the Golden Hills program.

A brief recess was called at 7:33 PM, and the meeting reconvened at 7:43 PM.

## IX. INTERVIEWS FOR COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT CANDIDATES

The pending retirement of Jay Speck effective December 31, 2016, will create a vacancy in the position of Solano County Superintendent of Schools. At a special meeting held July 13, 2016, the Board determined a process for filling the vacancy by soliciting applications from eligible candidates. A Board Ad Hoc Committee reviewed the applications received and invited the top two candidates who most closely met the Board's desired criteria for a new county superintendent to interview for the position. Each candidate was given 30 minutes in which to make an opening statement and answer a series of 11 questions from the Board.

Trustee Dean explained the interview procedures and noted that application packets for both candidates were available outside the meeting room. Candidates drew a number to determine who would be interviewed first. The candidate not being interviewed was asked to wait outside the room so as not to have an undue advantage by hearing the questions in advance. Mrs. Estrella-Henderson was interviewed first followed by Duneen De Bruhl.

At the conclusion of the interviews, the Board listened to comments from 10 members of the public. Each was permitted three minutes to speak. Andrew Ownby, Rocio Moreno, Bethany Smith, Juan Cisnaros, Kim Govi, Brian Dolan, Carmen Rodriguez, Lidia Marin, Alan Kerzin, and Shereene

Wilkerson all spoke in favor of appointing Mrs. Estrella Henderson as the new County Superintendent of Schools.

Board Members wrote down the name of their preferred candidate, the papers were collected, and the responses transferred to a large chart for the audience to see. Mrs. Estrella-Henderson received the support of all seven Board Members.

Motion was made by Trustee Silva, seconded by Trustee Coleman, and carried by a unanimous roll call vote of those present to appoint Lisette Estrella-Henderson to fill the vacancy beginning in January 2017 through the end of Mr. Speck's existing term on January 7, 2019.

There were no further comments from the community.

#### XI. BOARD DISCUSSION

##### (a) Board Ad Hoc Committee Update

Trustee Dean reported that the next meeting of the Board Ad Hoc Committee, consisting of less than a quorum of the Board Members, to further discuss setting the County Superintendent's salary. An update will be presented to the Board during November's regular meeting.

**RESOLUTION NO. B16-17-10  
FILIPINO AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH & LARRY ITLIONG DAY**

**WHEREAS**, October 18, 1587, marks the earliest documented proof of Filipino presence in the continental United States having arrived by ship and setting foot in Morro Bay, California; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1763, the first permanent Filipino settlement in the continental United States was established in St. Malo, Louisiana, which set in motion a concentration of critical economic, cultural, social, and other notable contributions by Filipino Americans who have helped develop our Nation’s history in countless ways; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1906, the Sekada signified the first wave of Filipino farm workers to arrive in America, some of whom settled in the Suisun Valley, sent their children to Gomer School, labored as farm workers, and were an integral part of Solano County’s agricultural economy; and

**WHEREAS**, Filipino Americans comprised a large sector of the workforce at Mare Island Naval Shipyard and Travis Air Force Base, contributing to the military defense, growth, and history of Solano County; furthermore, according to the U.S. Census Bureau, a five-year trend indicates that the number of Filipino Americans in our community, State, and Nation continues to grow, and they remain the largest Asian American group in Solano County, second largest in California, and third largest in the Nation; and

**WHEREAS**, born in the Philippines on October 25, 1913, the late Larry Itliong worked on the railroads and as a migrant farmworker in California, and became a leader in one of the greatest social justice movements in America as he organized 1,500 Filipinos to strike against the grape growers of Delano, while repeatedly suffering through violence, and courageously called upon other farmworkers led by César Chávez and Dolores Huerta to join forces with the Filipinos to strike together, and the two groups combined to establish the United Farm Workers of America; and

**WHEREAS**, the communities of Solano County have long recognized the contributions of Filipino Americans, several of whom have dedicated many years to serving the public through military and civil service, elected offices, and political policymaking in our cities and school districts.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that, in accordance with California Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 58, dated July 14, 2015, and Assembly Bill No. 7, dated June 30, 2015, the Solano County Board of Education recognizes October as Filipino American History Month and October 25 as “Larry Itliong Day” and encourages teachers, students, and all members of our community to study the chronicles, strong values, rich culture, and enduring legacy of Filipino Americans as well as the significance of the positive role they have proudly and humbly played in transforming the diverse history of our great Nation

**RESOLUTION NO. B16-17-11  
NATIONAL BULLYING PREVENTION MONTH**

**WHEREAS**, the Solano County Office of Education (SCOE) upholds the right of students and staff to attend and work in a school environment that promotes physical and emotional safety, and in which teaching, learning, and working are not disrupted or distracted; expectations for behavior are clearly communicated; consequences for infractions are consistently and fairly applied; and drugs, bullying, intimidation, harassment, discrimination, and fear are not present, as these concerns can create barriers to concentration, learning, working, and achievement, and contribute to low self-esteem, depression, anger, and, in extreme cases, violence or suicide; and

**WHEREAS**, the most effective approach to creating safe school environments requires a comprehensive, coordinated effort including school-, district-, and community-wide strategies where all institutions, organizations, and individuals must accept responsibility for their crucial roles and collaborate to establish a positive environment for teaching, learning, and working; and

**WHEREAS**, SCOE supports local schools, districts, and communities in developing, implementing, and monitoring policies and programs to address the prevention, intervention, and elimination of bullying, harassment, and discrimination; and

**WHEREAS**, more than 160,000 students in the U.S. stay home from school each day because they are scared of being bullied; thus, the month of October has been declared National Bullying Prevention Month, a campaign in response to the need to raise awareness about bullying that provides schools and communities with an opportunity to educate students, parents, and others about the different forms of bullying, their role in bullying prevention, and the importance of lifting others up rather than tearing them down.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that SCOE supports the goals of National Bullying Prevention Month and will work with a broad spectrum of local community stakeholders, parents, students, teachers, and staff to develop, implement, and monitor policies and programs that foster and support a positive school climate free from harassment, bullying, discrimination, and violence; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board encourages all students, teachers, staff, and community members to value diversity; engage in respectful interactions and responsive problem solving; never tolerate cruelty; stand up for others; speak out against bullying behavior; and urge our lawmakers to invest in and promote comprehensive, coordinated, and collaborative strategies to prevent bullying, harassment, discrimination, and violence in our schools so that all students have the opportunity to attend school, engage in classroom activities, and achieve academic success.

**RESOLUTION NO. B16-17-12**  
**SCHOOL BUS SAFETY AWARENESS MONTH**

**WHEREAS**, each day there are about 480,000 public school buses on our Nation’s roads transporting approximately 26 million K-12 students (53% of total students), twice a day (52 million student trips), with an additional estimated 5 million daily extracurricular activity roundtrips, and close to one million of these children are being transported to and from school and school-related activities by school buses in California; and

**WHEREAS**, each year school bus drivers across the U.S. log over 4.4 billion miles behind the wheel and provide over 10 billion individual pupil rides for our Nation’s children making these vehicles the largest form of public transit in the United States, yet they boast the best safety record of any other form of transportation: 172 times safer than the family automobile, 8 times safer than railroad passenger trains, 4 times safer than transit or intercity buses, and 8 times safer than scheduled airlines; and

**WHEREAS**, the U.S. Department of Transportation requires every school bus to have six additional safety features that are not found on any other public or private vehicle; and

**WHEREAS**, school buses travel every day on urban and rural roadways and are subjected to countless obstacles posing potential danger to precious passengers; and

**WHEREAS**, Solano County Office of Education’s transportation professionals are dedicated to protecting our students and take measures to ensure the safety of children, drivers, and others on the road including annual mandated training, adherence to strict federal drug testing policies, performing regularly scheduled inspections of all buses, and promptly reporting when maintenance is needed; and

**WHEREAS**, California recognizes October as School Bus Safety Awareness Month, and our Nation identifies October 17-21, 2016, as National School Bus Safety Week whose theme this year is “Bully Free Zone!” signifying that riding the bus to and from school is a safe place in which bullying is not tolerated.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Solano County Board of Education realizes the importance of school bus safety; acknowledges October as California School Bus Safety Awareness Month and October 17-21, 2016, as National School Bus Safety Week; and encourages all citizens to drive safely near school zones, avoid distractions, be mindful of school bus signals, and remind our children to use caution when waiting for or getting on and off the bus in order to avoid school bus accidents and protect the precious riders on board.

**RESOLUTION NO. B16-17-15**  
**RED RIBBON WEEK**

**WHEREAS**, the use of alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs has reached staggering levels in California and throughout the United States, and the abuse of these substances creates immense societal costs and prevents millions of people from reaching their full potential at school, on the job, and in their communities, thus making prevention and treatment a national priority in order to improve the well-being of America and protect our Nation’s citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, the rate of abuse of drugs, alcohol, and tobacco by our Nation’s youth is cause for alarm, and research indicates that children of parents who talk to their teens regularly about the dangers of drugs are 42% less likely to use drugs than those who don’t, and yet only a quarter of teens report having these conversations with their parents or other caring adults, and studies further show that youth who avoid the early use of alcohol, tobacco, and marijuana are less likely to engage in other harmful behaviors that are dangerous and harmful to both their health and future such as crime, delinquency, and the use of other illegal drugs; and

**WHEREAS**, the most effective way to reduce the cycle of youth addiction and the crime it causes is to reduce demand beginning with the active participation of families, schools, and community organizations in visible prevention education efforts and outreach programs that clearly communicate to children the dangers inherent in tobacco use, as well as drug and alcohol abuse; and

**WHEREAS**, Red Ribbon Week highlights the importance of teaching good habits early to children, spreading awareness about dangerous behaviors, not being afraid to stand up for one’s self and others despite peer pressure, setting a good example, and being a positive influence in the lives of young people by promoting healthy lifestyle choices; and

**WHEREAS**, the Solano County Office of Education (SCOE) is committed to abolishing the destructive impact that substance abuse has had in our homes, schools, workplaces, and economy and is dedicated to an alcohol-, tobacco-, and drug-free lifestyle through activities such as prevention education services provided through SCOE’s Youth Development Department.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Solano County Board of Education hereby supports Red Ribbon Week, October 23–31, and this year’s theme "*You Only Live Once (YOLO). Be Drug Free,*" which aims to promote good overall health; reminds young people that they have worth and should love themselves enough to take care of themselves because they cannot use drugs and consider themselves healthy; reminds adults that we must work every day to support the development of protective skills and competencies that each young person needs in life to make healthy choices and prevent alcohol, tobacco, and other drug use; and encourages all citizens to participate in this prevention campaign, making a visible statement that we are firmly committed to an alcohol-, tobacco-, and drug-free county.
