**ADMINISTRATIVE PROFESSIONALS WEEK**

**WHEREAS**, Administrative Professionals Week was established in 1952 as National Secretaries Week in an effort to recognize clerical workers for their contributions in the workplace and attract people to secretarial/administrative careers; however, it underwent a name change in 2000 to reflect the shifting and expanding responsibilities of the modern administrative workforce; and

**WHEREAS**, Administrative Professionals Week is observed worldwide during the last full week in April and has become one of the largest workplace observances, being held this year from April 19 – April 25, 2009, with Administrative Professionals Day observed on April 22<sup>nd</sup>, and

**WHEREAS**, in addition to shaping their individual careers, today's administrative professionals are also shaping the future of their profession as a whole through leading by example; making a commitment to continuing education and lifelong learning; taking pride in their work and profession; approaching all projects with a high level of integrity and professionalism; bringing greater value to their employers by building professional networks to exchange ideas, best practices, and finding workable solutions to problems; mentoring and training others; and educating employers about the value that administrative professionals bring to their organizations; and

**WHEREAS**, this year's theme, *Excellence in Action*, denotes how administrative professionals are increasingly important in today's unstable business climate where many companies are: cutting positions and expecting administrative assistants to take on more and more work and embrace varied roles; placing greater value on soft skills such as adaptability to new situations and interpersonal and communication abilities since technical skills can be taught, but soft skills are more innate; and requiring an aptitude for and mastery of advanced and ever-changing office technology; and

**WHEREAS**, administrative professionals have expanded their workplace roles significantly through the years in response to advances in technology and the changing needs of business by becoming the office information center; written, spoken, and electronic communications experts; problem solvers; innovative thinkers; leaders of on-site and virtual work groups; contributors to team projects; office organizers; historical record keepers; special event planners; coordinators of multiple schedules and calendars; project researchers; and handlers of a wider variety of duties beyond traditional clerical roles including numerous management functions; and

**WHEREAS**, these individuals manage multiple projects, are willing to learn and accept new challenges, and create excellence every day by taking pride in doing quality work and in their efforts to upgrade their knowledge and skills through continual learning, and the labor of these administrative professionals is critical to the overall effort to successfully educate Solano County's public school children; and

**WHEREAS**, administrative professionals, including secretaries, executive assistants, office managers, and other office support staff represent one of the largest segments of the world's workforce numbering around 4.2 million according to current U.S. Department of Labor statistics with an additional 1.4 million supervisors of office and administrative support staff and a projected growth of 8.5% through the year 2016; and

**WHEREAS**, of these numbers, approximately 552 full- and part-time office/clerical staff work in Solano County's public schools, districts, community college, and county office of education; and
