**RESOLUTION NO. B08-09-23  
ASIAN/PACIFIC AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH**

**WHEREAS**, the State of California has one of the largest Asian/Pacific American populations in the United States and is home to over 723,331 (11.5%) public school students of Asian or Pacific Islander descent in kindergarten through grade twelve, with approximately 10,516 (15.4%) of these K-12 students plus 3,725 (20.6%) community college students calling Solano County home; and

**WHEREAS**, these students reflect the great tapestry of cultures and customs of the many countries that comprise Asia and the Pacific Islands including China, Japan, Korea, Hawaii, Vietnam, the Philippines, and others, each with its own colorful traditions, foods, languages, and religions; and

**WHEREAS**, this year's theme "Leadership to Meet the Challenges of a Changing World" focuses on the contributions of the diverse nations of people from Asia and the Pacific Islands whose talents and hard work in fields such as science and exploration, the arts, education, medicine, public service, and entrepreneurship, have helped challenge the minds of our next generation, expand commerce and innovation, and make America a strong and vibrant society; people like champion figure skater Michelle Kwan, professional golfer Tiger Woods, designer Vera Wang, writer Amy Tan, actor Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson, former Congressman Norm Mineta, former Governor of Hawaii Benjamin Cayetano, and the heroic 442nd Regimental Combat Team of World War II; and

**WHEREAS**, to honor the achievements of Asian/Pacific Americans, the United States Congress by Public Law 102-450 as amended has designated the month of May each year as "Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month" which is celebrated annually at the local, state, and national levels; and

**WHEREAS**, May is a fitting time to reflect on the Asian/Pacific Islander experience as it coincides with two historical milestones: May 7, 1843, when the first Japanese immigrants arrived in the United States, and May 10, 1869, when Chinese workers helped to complete the transcontinental railroad, persevering to overcome tremendous prejudice and discrimination.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Solano County Board of Education does hereby recognize the month of May as Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month and encourages all citizens to find opportunities to develop pride in his or her own identity and heritage; seek the common humanity underlying all people by understanding, respecting, and accepting the uniqueness and traditions of others of different racial, religious, and ethnic groups; and broaden their multicultural knowledge by participating in appropriate activities that increase their human understanding.

**RESOLUTION NO. B08-09-24  
TEEN PREGNANCY PREVENTION MONTH**

**WHEREAS**, teen pregnancy is a serious problem that significantly impacts the health and well-being of teenagers and their families as well as the community at large and is closely linked to a number of critical social issues such as poverty, educational attainment, involvement in the criminal justice and child welfare systems, and more, costing U.S. taxpayers \$9.1 billion each year primarily due to the negative social and health outcomes for the children of teen parents; and

**WHEREAS**, more than 700,000 teenagers in the United States become pregnant each year (about 3 of every 10), which is the highest teen pregnancy rate among comparable countries and disproportionately affects Native-American, Latina, and African-American teen girls; and

**WHEREAS**, less than half of the mothers who have a child before they turn 18 ever graduate from high school, and less than 2% achieve a college degree by age 30; and

**WHEREAS**, the children of teen mothers are more likely to be born at a low birth weight, grow up in poverty, experience abuse and neglect, and enter the child welfare system than the children of those who delay motherhood; and

**WHEREAS**, efforts to promote medically accurate, responsible sex education, including encouraging open communication between teens and adults, have been shown to be effective in reducing the teen birth rate; and

**WHEREAS**, the Solano County Department of Health and Social Services maintains collaborative partnerships with other agencies to offer resources and workshops to assist parents with talking to their teens and pre-teens about sex education and provides comprehensive case management services for pregnant and parenting teens.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Solano County Board of Education hereby recognizes May as Teen Pregnancy Prevention Month; appreciates the contributions of individuals, organizations, and programs that help guide our youth toward getting an education and making wise decisions in their lives; and urges adults and teens to initiate and develop receptive communication.

**ANNIVERSARY OF *BROWN V. BOARD OF EDUCATION OF TOPEKA***

**WHEREAS**, this year marks the 55<sup>th</sup> anniversary of *Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka*, the landmark 1954 decision of the U.S. Supreme Court that “separate educational facilities are inherently unequal” and called for equity in public education; and

**WHEREAS**, the *Brown v. Board of Education* decision denied the legal basis for segregation in Kansas and 20 other states forever changing race relations in the United States and providing the foundation for dramatic educational reform and improvement in communities and districts making it a priority for all students to have a high quality education and opportunities for success; and

**WHEREAS**, Article 1, Section 28(c) of the Constitution gives all students, teachers, and staff the right to safe, secure, and peaceful schools, and considerable progress has been made since 1954; however, issues affecting their physical and psychological safety must continue to be proactively addressed and sustained for achievement and success by all students, teachers, and staff to be fully realized; and

**WHEREAS**, Education Code §233 and §233.5 formally embodies the promise of *Brown v. Board of Education* and mandates proactive instruction of students on encouraging morals, manners, and citizenship while discouraging discrimination and hate crimes.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Solano County Board of Education commemorates the anniversary of *Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka* and encourages schools, families, and local communities to celebrate, reflect, and participate in strategies and activities that promote the principles of equity, justice, and character by practicing understanding and communication.
