**RESOLUTION NO. B13-14-05  
FILIPINO AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH**

**WHEREAS**, October 18, 1587, marks the earliest documented proof of Filipino presence in the continental United States having arrived by ship and setting foot in Morro Bay, California; and

**WHEREAS**, the year 1763 is recognized as the date of the first permanent settlement of Filipinos in the continental United States in St. Malo, Louisiana, setting into motion a national observance in order to focus on the story of our Nation's past from a new perspective by concentrating on the critical economic, cultural, social, and other notable contributions by Filipino Americans who have helped develop our Nation's history in countless ways; and

**WHEREAS**, according to the U.S. Census Bureau, a five-year trend indicates that the number of Filipino Americans in our community, state, and nation continues to grow, and they remain the largest Asian American group in Solano County (approximately 39,956 or 9.7% of the total county population), second largest in California (approx. 1,193,305 or 3.2% of the total population), and third largest in the Nation (approx. 2,549,545 or 0.8% of the total population); and

**WHEREAS**, Filipino Americans have played vital roles in forming our Nation, from visionaries to inventors, Olympians to astronomers, military officers to elected officials, chefs to physicians, pageant winners to public school teachers, and many other commendable careers; and

**WHEREAS**, this year also celebrates the 107<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Sekada signifying the first wave of Filipino farm workers to arrive in America, some of whom settled in the Suisun Valley, sent their children to Gomer School, and were an integral part of Solano County's agricultural history; and

**WHEREAS**, the communities of Solano County have long recognized the contributions of Filipino Americans, several of whom have dedicated years to serving the public as policymakers and in leadership positions including: Larry Asera (Vallejo City Council, Solano County Board of Supervisors, Solano County Board of Education); Dr. Rozzana Verder-Aliga (Vallejo City Unified School District (USD) Governing Board, Solano County Board of Education, voted one of the 100 Most Influential Filipina Woman in the U.S. in 2009 by the Filipina Women's Network); Pete Sanchez (former Mayor of Suisun City); Pete Rey, Hermie Sunga, and Cris Villanueva (Vallejo City Council); the late Oggee Villanueva (Vallejo City USD Governing Board); Rev. Dr. A.C. "Tony" Ubalde, Jr. (Vallejo City USD Governing Board, Solano Community College Governing Board); Abe Bautista (Fairfield-Suisun USD Governing Board); Belle Orpilla (former Field Representative for California Senator Wes Chesbro); and Mel Orpilla (author, lecturer, local chapter president of Filipino American National Historical Society); and

**WHEREAS**, Filipino Americans comprised a large workforce sector at Mare Island Naval Shipyard and Travis Air Force Base, contributing to the military defense, economy, and history of Solano County, as well as laboring as some of the early farm workers in the Suisun Valley, thus, contributing to the agricultural economy of our county; and

**WHEREAS**, efforts must continue to promote the study of Filipino American history and culture, so mandated in the mission statement of the Filipino American National Historical Society, because the role of Filipino Americans and those of other minorities have been largely underrated in the writing, teaching, and learning of United States history; and

**WHEREAS**, it is imperative for Filipino American youths to have positive role models and to instill in them the importance of education, complemented with the richness of their ethnicity and the values of their legacy.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Solano County Board of Education recognizes October as Filipino American History Month, with annual and national observances throughout the United States and its territories, as a significant time to study the advancement of Filipino Americans in the history of the United States; as a favorable time of celebration, remembrance, reflection, and motivation; and as a relevant time to renew more efforts toward research, examination, and promulgation of Filipino American history and culture in order to provide an opportunity for all Americans to learn and appreciate more about Filipino Americans and their historic contributions to our Nation, these United States of America.

NATIONAL BULLYING PREVENTION MONTH**

**WHEREAS**, the Solano County Office of Education (SCOE) upholds the rights of students to attend, and staff to work in, schools that are safe and free from violence, harassment, bullying, discrimination, and the fear of harm, because these concerns can create barriers to learning and contribute to low self-esteem, depression, anger, and, in extreme cases, school violence or suicide; and

**WHEREAS**, providing a safe school environment that ensures both the physical and emotional safety of students and staff creates the conditions necessary to promote greater academic achievement; and

**WHEREAS**, a safe school environment is one that is free of intimidation and harassment; where teaching and learning are not distracted; disruptions are minimized; drugs, violence, bullying, and fear are not present; students are not discriminated against; expectations for behavior are clearly communicated; and consequences for infractions are consistently and fairly applied; and

**WHEREAS**, the most effective approach to creating safe school environments requires a comprehensive, coordinated effort including school-, district-, and community-wide strategies where all institutions, organizations, and individuals must accept responsibility for their critical roles and collaborate to establish a positive environment for teaching and learning; and

**WHEREAS**, SCOE supports local schools, districts, and communities in developing, implementing, and monitoring policies and programs to address the prevention, intervention, and elimination of bullying, harassment, and discrimination; and

**WHEREAS**, more than 160,000 students in the U.S. stay home from school each day because they are scared of being bullied, so the month of October has been declared National Bullying Prevention Month, a campaign in response to the need to raise awareness about bullying that provides schools and communities with an opportunity to educate students, parents, and others about their role in bullying prevention.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that SCOE supports the goals of National Bullying Prevention Month and will work with a broad spectrum of local community stakeholders, parents, students, teachers, and staff to develop, implement, and monitor policies and programs that foster and support a positive school climate free from harassment, bullying, discrimination, and violence; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board encourages the state of California to support and invest in comprehensive, coordinated, and collaborative strategies to prevent bullying, harassment, discrimination, and violence in our schools so that all students have the opportunity to attend school, engage in classroom activities, and achieve academic success.

**RESOLUTION NO. B13-14-07**  
**SCHOOL BUS SAFETY AWARENESS MONTH**

**WHEREAS**, each day there are about 480,000 public school buses on our Nation’s roads transporting approximately 26 million K-12 students (53% of total students), twice a day (52 million student trips), with an additional estimated 5 million daily extracurricular activity roundtrips, and close to one million of these children are being transported to and from school and school-related activities by school buses in California; and

**WHEREAS**, each year school bus drivers across the U.S. log over 4.4 billion miles behind the wheel and provide over 10 billion individual pupil rides for our Nation’s children making these vehicles the largest form of public transit in the United States, yet they boast the best safety record of any other form of transportation: 172 times safer than the family automobile, 8 times safer than railroad passenger trains, 4 times safer than transit or intercity buses, and 8 times safer than scheduled airlines; and

**WHEREAS**, the U.S. Department of Transportation requires six additional safety features be built into every school bus which are not found on any other public or private vehicle; and

**WHEREAS**, school buses travel every day on urban and rural roadways and are subjected to countless obstacles posing potential danger to passengers; and

**WHEREAS**, Solano County Office of Education’s transportation professionals are dedicated to protecting our students and take measures to ensure the safety of children, drivers, and others on the road including annual mandated training, adherence to strict federal drug testing policies, performing regularly scheduled inspections of all buses, and promptly reporting when maintenance is needed; and

**WHEREAS**, California recognizes October as School Bus Safety Awareness Month, and our Nation identifies October 21-25, 2013, as National School Bus Safety Week whose theme this year is “Stand Back from the Yellow and Black” reminding students and motorists about the dangers that exist outside the school bus.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Solano County Board of Education realizes the importance of school bus safety and acknowledges October as California School Bus Safety Awareness Month, and October 21-25, 2013, as National School Bus Safety Week, and encourages all citizens to drive safely near school zones, avoid distractions, be mindful of school bus signals, and remind our children to use caution when waiting for or getting on and off the bus in an effort to avoid school bus accidents and protect the precious riders on board.

**RESOLUTION NO. B13-14-08**  
**RED RIBBON WEEK**

**WHEREAS**, alcohol, tobacco, and other drug use, while currently seeing a downward trend, remains at staggering levels in California and throughout the United States, and the abuse of these substances creates immense societal costs and prevents millions of people from reaching their full potential at school, on the job, and in their communities, and making prevention and treatment a national priority in order to improve the well-being of America and protect our Nation’s citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, the rate of abuse of drugs, alcohol, and tobacco by our Nation’s youth is cause for alarm, and research indicates that children of parents who talk to their teens regularly about the dangers of drugs are 42% less likely to use drugs than those who don’t, and yet only a quarter of teens report having these conversations with their parents or other caring adults, and studies further show that youth who avoid the early use of alcohol, tobacco, and marijuana are less likely to engage in other harmful behaviors that are dangerous and harmful to both their health and future such as crime, delinquency, and the use of other illegal drugs; and

**WHEREAS**, the most effective way to reduce the cycle of youth addiction and the crime it causes is to reduce demand beginning with the active participation of families, schools, and community organizations in visible prevention education efforts and outreach programs that clearly communicate to children the dangers inherent in tobacco use, and drug and alcohol abuse; and

**WHEREAS**, Red Ribbon Week highlights the importance of teaching good habits early to children, spreading awareness about dangerous behaviors, not being afraid to stand up for one’s self and others despite peer pressure, setting a good example, and being a positive influence in the lives of young people by promoting healthy lifestyle choices; and

**WHEREAS**, the Solano County Office of Education (SCOE) is committed to abolishing the destructive impact that substance abuse has had in our homes, schools, workplaces, and economy and is dedicated to an alcohol-, tobacco-, and drug-free lifestyle through activities such as prevention education services provided through SCOE’s Youth Development Department.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Solano County Board of Education does hereby support Red Ribbon Week, October 23–31, and this year’s theme "*A Healthy Me is Drug Free*," which aims to promote good overall health; remind young people that drugs and alcohol are off limits because they cannot use drugs and consider themselves healthy; remind adults that we must work every day to support the development of protective skills and competencies that each young person needs in life to make healthy choices and prevent alcohol, tobacco, other drug use; and encourages all citizens to participate in this prevention campaign, making a visible statement that we are firmly committed to an alcohol-, tobacco-, and drug-free county.

**WHEREAS**, schools make substantial contributions to the future of America and to the development of our Nation's young people as knowledgeable, responsible, and productive citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, excellence in education is dependent on safe, secure, and peaceful school settings; and

**WHEREAS**, the safety and well-being of many students, teachers, and school staff are unnecessarily jeopardized by crime and violence, substance abuse, gangs, bullying, poor discipline, vandalism, and absenteeism in our schools; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the responsibility of all citizens to enhance the learning experiences of young people by helping to ensure fair and effective discipline, promote good citizenship, and generally make school safe and secure; and

**WHEREAS**, all leaders, especially educators, law enforcement, government, and business, should eagerly collaborate with each other to focus public attention on school safety and identify, develop, and promote innovative answers to these critical issues; and

**WHEREAS**, numerous schools and school districts throughout the country, along with national programs, are among those developing innovative answers; and

**WHEREAS**, the observance of America's Safe Schools Week will substantially promote efforts to provide our entire Nation's schools with positive and safe learning climates.

**VETERANS DAY COMMEMORATION**

**WHEREAS**, on August 2, 1964, North Vietnamese torpedo boats attacked the Navy destroyer USS Maddox and President Lyndon Johnson presented the Tonkin Gulf Resolution to Congress, which voted overwhelmingly on August 7 in favor of taking all necessary measures to repel any armed attack against the United States and to prevent further aggression; and

**WHEREAS**, from Ia Drang to Khe Sanh, from Hue to Saigon, and countless villages in between, our Servicemembers pushed through jungles, rice paddies, punishing heat, and monsoons fighting heroically to protect the ideals we hold dear as Americans; and

**WHEREAS**, we observe the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War with solemn reverence upon the valor of a generation that served with honor; and we pay tribute to the more than 3 million Servicemembers who left their families to serve bravely, a world away from everything they knew and everyone they loved; and
