MINUTES Regular Meeting December 14, 2011

The Solano County Board of Education met in regular session on Wednesday, December 14, 2011, at 5100 Business Center Drive in Fairfield, California.

I. CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG

Board President Larry Asera, Trustee Area 5, called the meeting to order at 10:35 AM and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

III. APPROVAL AND ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Mr. Asera welcomed the Board members, staff, and community members to the last meeting of 2011. He announced that he and Dr. Verder-Aliga were participating in an iPad Pilot Project and would provide feedback on whether using an electronic agenda is a viable means for the Board to reduce the amount of paper generated for its meetings.

Dr. Verder-Aliga requested moving agenda item IX.(a) Proclamation Commemorating Pearl Harbor Day, currently under New Business, to immediately follow item VI. Consent Items in consideration of the guests in attendance for this item.

Motion was made by Mr. Galvan, seconded by Dr. Verder-Aliga, and unanimously carried by a vote of those present to amend the agenda as requested.

Motion was made by Mrs. Coleman, seconded by Mrs. Bates, and unanimously carried by a vote of those present to approve and adopt the agenda as amended.

IV. OATH OF OFFICE

Mr. Speck administered the oath of office to returning Trustees Michelle Coleman (Area 1), Ray Silva (Area 2), Larry Asera (Area 5), and Dr. Rozzana Verder-Aliga (Area 7), all of whom ran unopposed.

Mrs. Coleman said she is happy to be a member of the Board and is glad to serve the community.

Mr. Silva stated that he enjoys being a Board member very much. Mr. Asera added that this is Mr. Silva's sixth term, and he is the longest serving member currently on the Board.

Dr. Verder-Aliga commented that it is a pleasure serving on the Board. She thanked the community and her family for their ongoing support and said she was happy to run unopposed.

Mr. Asera is beginning his fourth term on the Board, and he introduced his guests who came to witness his swearing in: wife Lilibeth, niece Maya Corpus, and best friend Tony Smernes. He is proud of the good job the Board does and pleased to start another term with his colleagues again.

V. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- (a) A president of the County Board of Education will be elected.

Mr. Silva nominated Doug Ford to serve as president, and Dr. Verder-Aliga seconded the nomination.

Mr. Galvan nominated Dr. Verder-Aliga for president, and Mrs. Bates seconded the nomination stating that the vice president historically becomes president. Dr. Verder-Aliga accepted the nomination stating that she is committed to education.

Mr. Ford withdrew from the nomination.

Motion was made by Mr. Galvan, seconded by Mrs. Bates, and unanimously carried by a vote of those present to elect Dr. Verder-Aliga to serve as Board President for 2012.

Mr. Speck thanked Mr. Asera for serving as Board President for the past two years because it provided continuity during his transition into the superintendency. Since Mr. Asera had previously served as president and had already received an engraved gavel for that term, Mr. Speck recognized Mr. Asera as the out-going president with a set of ship bookends to commemorate his association with the California Maritime Academy and his office on Mare Island.

Mr. Asera expressed his gratitude to Mr. Speck and the Board members for the gift, and he passed the gavel to Dr. Verder-Aliga to finish the rest of the meeting. Dr. Verder-Aliga thanked Mr. Asera for his past service to the Board.

- (b) A vice president of the County Board of Education will be elected.

Motion was made by Mr. Galvan, seconded by Mrs. Coleman, and unanimously carried by a vote of those present to elect Mr. Ford to serve as Board Vice President for 2012.

- (c) A representative to the Solano County School Boards' Association (SCSBA) will be elected.

Motion was made by Mr. Galvan, seconded by Mr. Asera, and unanimously carried by a vote of those present to elect Mrs. Coleman to serve as the Board's representative to the SCSBA.

VI. CONSENT ITEMS

Motion was made by Mrs. Coleman, seconded by Mrs. Bates, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote of those present to approve the items on the consent calendar consisting of the following.

IX. NEW BUSINESS *(See agenda item III. above)*

- (a) Proclamation Commemorating Pearl Harbor Day

December 7th marks the 70th anniversary of Pearl Harbor Day when thousands of lives were lost and America was thrust into World War II. Dr. Verder-Aliga, who is the daughter of a World War II veteran, and Mr. Asera, whose grandfather fought in World War I and his father in World War II, read the proclamation memorializing this somber occasion. (Attachment E)

Motion was made by Mrs. Coleman, seconded by Mr. Silva, and unanimously carried by a roll call vote of those present to adopt the proclamation commemorating the attack on Pearl Harbor and honoring the World War II veterans and all military personnel for their dedicated service.

The Board members signed a ceremonial copy of the adopted proclamation and presented it to Nestor Aliga and Paul Del Rosario of the American Legion Post 603. Mr. Del Rosario thanked the Board for its action and mentioned several other Pearl Harbor Day ceremonies taking place throughout the community. He made a prepared statement honoring World War II veterans, surviving or deceased, as well as all U.S. military service members who have served to protect our liberties.

VII. CORRESPONDENCE

Mr. Speck read a letter from Dilenna Harris, Executive Director of the Solano County Library Foundation, thanking him for speaking about community efforts to curb the high school dropout rate at the October launch of the Literacy in Education Access Resource Network (LEARN) initiative.

VIII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- (a) Solano Focus on Public Education

Lisette Estrella-Henderson, Associate Superintendent of Student Programs and Educational Services, reported on the state of academic achievement of Solano County's public school students. A copy of the report was distributed to each Board member, and Mrs. Estrella-Henderson explained that the purpose for compiling this information is to assist community members in understanding and supporting the educational accomplishments of students in our local public schools.

The data contained in the report is based on information released by the California Department of Education, such as the Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) program, California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE), and California English Language Development Test (CELDT), as well as benchmarks adopted by the State Board of Education. Achievement data was compiled by grade level for the four core subject areas.

The report shows that overall assessment scores for our students are improving and the ways in which SCOE is providing technical assistance and support to our districts to help them continue to meet the needs of our county's public school students. Mrs. Estrella-Henderson pointed out several highlights in the report including Solano County's student demographics (pages 5-6) and graduation and dropout rates (pages 8-9).

Mrs. Bates commented that members of the community often talk about how horrible our schools are and how poorly the students are doing, while those of us in the field of education see things quite differently. Mrs. Estrella-Henderson stated that the achievement data shows our county's students continue to improve across all subjects, and Solano is comparable to others counties in California even though we have more diverse demographics. The report will be available on SCOE's website, or hard copies are available on request. Mr. Speck added that SCOE's 2012 Annual Report calendar contains an additional section this year about local academic performance data.

Mrs. Bates suggested that it would be helpful for the Board to have some talking points that the members could use to spread accurate information throughout the community in an effort to change the public's misperceptions.

(b) Quarterly Reports on *Williams* Uniform Complaints

Mrs. Estrella-Henderson stated that, as part of the *Williams* Uniform Complaint Procedures, school districts and SCOE are required to report, on a quarterly basis, summary data regarding the nature and resolution of all complaints. The reports must indicate the number of complaints by general subject area as well as the number of resolved and unresolved complaints. No complaints were filed during the time period of July 1, 2011, through September 30, 2011 for the following three programs: Juvenile Court and Community School at Golden Hills Education Center, Division of Unaccompanied Children Services (DUCS), and Juvenile Detention Facility. (c) Human Resources Report

Janet Harden, Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources and Workforce Development, reported that two paraeducators for special education, a student support specialist in the Homeless/Foster Youth department, and a secretary for Educational Services had been hired in the past month.

(d) Financial Report

Lettie Allen, Associate Superintendent of Administrative Services and Operations, presented the financial report for November 2011-12, First Interim Report, and provided an update on facilities projects.

SCOE continues to stay within its budget. In November, revenue received from the state totaled \$8.7 million, while expenditures were \$14.3 million. The state has deferred much of our revenue into next year, but our reserves allow us to manage the situation.

Governor Brown announced yesterday a \$1 billion budget trigger decrease to education, although this amount is subject to change. He also announced a 51% cut to district school bus transportation which amounts to about \$1.7 million for Solano County with approximate cuts of \$70,000 for SCOE and \$402,000 for a large district like Vallejo City Unified School District. Additionally, the revenue limit will be reduced. Estimates at this time indicate a total reduction of about \$260 per average daily attendance (ADA). These cuts are scheduled to take effect on February 1, 2012. Our districts have been planning for this type of scenario, and we hope that will lessen the impact so they can make it through this difficult period. If anticipated state revenues are not realized, we could see another \$7 billion in cuts next year, which would double the reduction per ADA.

The State Allocation Board is scheduled to meet today at 2:00 PM, and SCOE's construction project at Golden Hills is on the agenda. We expect to receive confirmation that the project will be funded.

(e) Meetings/Special Dates

Mr. Speck's recent activities included: attending a Solano Transportation Authority awards dinner in which he was nominated for an award; giving annual *Williams* reports to Fairfield-Suisun, Vacaville, and Vallejo City USD governing boards; attending a retirement reception for longtime SCOE employee Roxie Allen; administering the oath of office to board members of the Vacaville and Travis USDs; attending the annual conference of the Association of Educational Service Agencies (AESA) where Mrs. Estrella-Henderson and Mrs. Harden both presented and brought positive attention to Solano County; and giving the keynote address at the Filipino Community of Solano County's 69th Anniversary and Coronation Ball and crowning the new Mrs. Philippines of Solano County.

Copies of the latest Fingertip Facts and SCOE Special Events booklet were distributed to the Board members, and Mr. Speck circulated a copy of the nationwide magazine *Perspectives*, published by AESA, featuring an article by Mrs. Estrella-Henderson and Sandy Jessop, Director of District and School Support, entitled "Coaching to Lead: Getting Results."

Mrs. Bates added that she and Mr. Speck had attended the funeral for Mary Ann May who worked as a nurse for SCOE for about 30 years before retiring in the mid 1990s.

Mr. Speck said he was pleased to announce that Rick Vaccaro, Director of Alternative Education, had been reelected to the Fairfield City Council and was selected to serve as Vice Mayor.

IX. NEW BUSINESS

- (a) Proclamation Commemorating Pearl Harbor Day (*See agenda item III. above*)
- (b) Decennial Trustee Area Redistricting

Mrs. Allen stated that Education Code requires that, following each decennial census, county board trustee areas must be analyzed and realigned, if necessary, to account for population shifts. The Board studied proposed adjustments to trustee area boundaries during its regular meeting on November 9, 2011, and recommended changes. GIS Consultants revised the maps, and the matter was being brought back for adoption by the Board. (Attachment F)

Mr. Galvan requested that the boundary between trustee areas 3 and 5, from I-680 to the Vallejo City border, should follow the Benicia City boundary rather than Lake Herman Road. The Board concurred with his request. Staff will notify GIS Consultants, and the revised boundary map will be brought back to the Board for approval at its regular meeting in January. Once the new trustee area boundaries are approved by the Board, the County Committee will vote to finalize the matter.

- (c) Establish Date, Time, and Location of 2012 Regular Meetings

In accordance with Education Code Sections 1009 – 1011 and Government Code Title 5, Division 2, Chapter 9, Section 54954*ff*, and pursuant to Board Policy 9320(I), the Board determined the dates, times, and location of its regular meetings for the coming year. (Attachment G)

Motion was made by Mr. Ford, seconded by Mr. Asera, and unanimously carried by a vote of those present to adopt the attached schedule of meetings for the 2012 calendar year.

X. COMMENTS FROM THE COMMUNITY

There were no comments from the community.

XI. BOARD DISCUSSION

(a) Board Member Reports

Some of the Board members gave a brief report on their recent activities including visits to any of SCOE's program sites and attendance at educational conferences and workshops.

Mrs. Coleman went to the California School Boards Association (CSBA) annual conference. She felt the sessions were wonderful and learned a lot from those she attended on topics such as green technology, the Kahn Academy's free online tutoring tool, and various free Google tools that can be particularly useful to students and teachers. She distributed a list of Google's web tools and services compiled by the session instructor. Sam Neustadt, Assistant Superintendent of SELPA, also presented at the conference.

Mr. Ford administered the oath of office to Dixon USD's two new board members.

Mrs. Bates attended a commemoration for veterans held in Fairfield; worked in Sacramento for four days on the California Subject Exam for Teachers (CSET); went to Roxie Allen's retirement party; attended a Retired Teachers of Solano County luncheon; attended her first San Francisco 49ers game; served as emcee for an event by three local rotary clubs (Sunrise, Lunch, and Twilight); and attended the swearing in of FSUSD's six board members. On January 6th Mrs. Bates will be sworn in as an Honorary Commander during a dinner at Travis Air Force Base.

Mr. Galvan administered the oath of office to Benicia USD's new and returning board members. He also expressed pride in the student leadership team and pupils of Benicia High School who recently experienced a controversial situation regarding holiday decorations on campus. The students on the leadership team conducted research, held campus-wide discussions and a vote, and maturely worked through a difficult and real-world process which turned out well in the end.

Mr. Asera thanked the Board members again for the gift and putting their trust in him as president for the past two years. His recent activities included administering the oath of office to Rev. Dr. Tony Ubalde, who was elected to the Vallejo City USD for the remaining two years of the late Cris Oggee Villanueva's term, and attending Roxie Allen's retirement party. Although Mr. Asera was unable to attend the Mrs. Philippines coronation celebration due to another engagement, others told him how nice the event was, and he thanked Mr. Speck for serving as the keynote speaker. Mr. Asera also talked about how the recent death of Vallejo Police Officer James Capoot had been very difficult on the community. Mr. Asera extended two invitations to the Board: December 16th, 6:00-10:00 PM, the Filipino Community of Solano County is holding a historic celebration at the USA World Classic Event Center (1525 Sonoma Boulevard in Vallejo) to honor four recently elected Filipino American officials (Dr. Rozzana Verder-Aliga, Rev. Dr. Tony Ubalde, Larry Asera, Bob Sampayan); December 19th, 5:00-7:00 PM, Congressman Mike Thompson is hosting a reception for Solano County's elected officials in his district to be held at the Asera Group offices at 500 Walnut Avenue, Officers' Quarters, on Mare Island.

Mr. Silva has just returned from a cruise down the Danube.

Dr. Verder-Aliga participated in the American Legion's commemoration of World War II veterans which was attended by 70 of the 131 surviving veterans living in Solano County. She plans to attend a couple of fundraisers this week for Officer Capoot's family: a walk on the Vallejo waterfront on Saturday morning and a holiday concert on Sunday at the Empress Theatre at 7:00 PM. She thanked the Board for electing her to serve as its president and vowed to do her best to advocate for public education. She wished happy holidays to everyone present.

(b) Suggestions on future Board agenda items

Mr. Galvan recommended that the Board consider the protocol and policy for placing items on its meeting agenda to ensure the procedure is clear.

Mr. Galvan said he is intrigued by the iPad Pilot Project, and he requested that staff also look into the possibility of replacing the existing dais monitors with touch screens. This might be a less expensive option, and the monitors are bigger than iPads making them easier to see.

XII. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 12:05 PM





**PROCLAMATION
COMMEMORATING THE 70th ANNIVERSARY OF PEARL HARBOR DAY AND
HONORING WORLD WAR II VETERANS**

WHEREAS, December 7, 2011, marked the 70th anniversary of Pearl Harbor Day when more than 2,400 lives were lost, over 1,100 were wounded, and then-President Franklin D. Roosevelt proclaimed it to be “a date which will live in infamy;” and

WHEREAS, on that day in 1941 the attacks on America, by air and by sea, changed our nation forever as we entered into World War II, a global conflict known as the deadliest in history, that claimed millions of fatalities worldwide; and

WHEREAS, Solano County residents were among those to answer our country’s call to military service by joining the armed forces or working in civil service at Mare Island in Vallejo and other nearby bases; and

WHEREAS, of the estimated 60,000 men and women stationed at Pearl Harbor in 1941, today there are fewer than 3,000 survivors nationwide, some of whom live in Solano County; and

WHEREAS, of the 41,000 veterans currently residing in Solano County, approximately 4,500 are World War II veterans; and

WHEREAS, the WWII generation changed the future of the entire world through its actions to defend the freedoms that our country holds so dear and establish the United Nations organization to foster international cooperation in an effort to prevent future conflicts.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that, on this historic anniversary, the Solano County Board of Education hereby honors all Pearl Harbor survivors and World War II veterans as well as those who died, military and civilians alike, by remembering their sacrifices, patriotism, and courage; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Solano County Board of Education honors all present-day military personnel and veterans and encourages all citizens to remember those who have served and thank those who are still serving in our armed forces for continuing to protect our liberties, and to especially remember and be grateful to the World War II Veterans and Pearl Harbor Survivors on the 70th anniversary of Pearl Harbor Day.


